This simple fact is creating a crisis of housing and healthcare for older adults with low incomes.



Atlee lost his job and was facing homelessness before he moved into Sterling Place in Lakeland, Florida. "I didn't know about places like this. This place took me in. I thought I was going to be homeless. It was a hard situation for me. Very hard," Atlee said. "It was a big-time blessing."

With declining health and incomes of less than \$12,000 a year, they have nothing to fall back on. Those who have found their way to a United Church Homes community feel fortunate.

To help residents age in place, most United Church Homes affordable housing communities have a grant-funded service coordinator, but they depend on the availability of other resources. The range of supportive services that residents need can vary widely from basic care to management of chronic health conditions.
